Livingston Theatre Company Hosts Behind the Scenes Discussion

I think it is safe to say we all miss live theater. The Livingston Theater Company (LTC) beat the odds, and pandemic restrictions, to complete two virtual shows this season - *The Addams Family* and *Spamalot*.

On May 2, the Livingston Alumni Association co-hosted a virtual All Alumni Theatre Afternoon "Behind the Scenes" discussion with several LTC cast members. The audience was treated to two clips from *The Addams Family* and *Spamalot*. Then, the cast took us behind the curtain and shared how they produced live theater in a virtual space.

Doing virtual theater had challenges. There were some issues getting the rights released for shows and there was some challenges recruiting actors. The LTC cast and directors did their very best to keep the company connected, via email and other social media chat platforms, because they were all over - in the dorms, in apartments, back at home. Despite the challenges, LTC made it work.

From the interviews, it was clear that these were live theater productions. There was coordination of sets, for example backgrounds for *The Adams Family* had to be sent to cast, selection of costumes, and scheduling time to rehearse and performing the scenes.

While the show was recorded for virtual viewing, the cast indicated they were doing live theater and not making a movie. It was different not having a theater full of people and the spontaneous reactions of an audience, however the student actors indicated that they had family and friends present during rehearsals and filming that helped it feel like a performance. Many times there was a director or another cast member feeding lines via Bluetooth headphone. Since everyone knew they were recording from home, real life was not edited out. In one example, one student actor's dog ran through the scene being recorded. Everyone laughed. Once the dog was out of the area, they began recording the scene again. The director reported how the actor was more relaxed and expressive in the scene. The interruption made the scene better.

Rutgers University, like many other schools, are working on their plans for the fall semester. It is not clear when theater, or other campus activities, will resume. LTC

is looking forward to another exciting year. They learned a lot about doing theater in a virtual medium. The Livingston Theater Company is hopeful to be back on stage very soon yet are prepared to do virtual theater if necessary.
